Course Duration and Volume of Learning

The course will be delivered over a period of 33 weeks, with a requirement to attend our facility for training for a minimum of 20 hours per week x 26 weeks, with 7 weeks of term break. The course is delivered over 520 hours of classroom, practical activity and directed study.

For a student to complete all his/her learning, he/she is required to spend time outside the formal scheduled activities. This is by way of research, review of existing cases, and use of multiple sources of information or real-life examples. Subsequently prepare formal summative assessment materials and any other activities to cover the breath of the course. Some of the time may be “on the job” whilst others will be by directed study.

Recognition of Prior Learning and Credit Transfer

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Transfer (CT) is the student’s opportunity to have their prior skills and/ or competencies recognised. These skills and competencies may relate to units you will undertake as part of this course, and as a result, can exempt you from studying – please talk to our Administration Staff to obtain full details.



Course Description and Requirement

This course covers the skills and knowledge required to perform a broad range of tasks on a variety of light vehicles in the automotive service and repair industry.

To gain the AUR40216 – Certificate IV in Automotive Mechanical Diagnosis qualification, a successful assessment outcome for following 10 units (1 core, and 9 electives) must be achieved.

Course Fees

Total fee for this course is AU\$ 7,300 (AU\$ 6,500 for tuition and AU\$ 800 for material fees) Fees are subject to change without notice. Material fees include learning resources, uniforms and tools (if applicable), and products used to produce for the qualification requirements.

- Students can pay the Course fee in full if they wish to, prior to the commencement of the course. However, it may be noted that, it is not the requirement of Australian Education Academy to pay more than 50 percent up front.

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Entry Requirement

The training package has no minimum requirement. AEA has the following minimum requirements that must be met:

(a) Age requirement:

All students must be 18 years or over at the time of entry into Australia or at the scheduled course commencement, whichever is earlier.

(b) Academic requirement:

Satisfactory completion of the equivalent of Australian Year 11 or Certificate III or higher.

(c) English language requirement:

A minimum IELTS (General) test score of 5.5 or equivalent for direct entry into a VET course. For more details on English language requirement visit <https://aust-education.com.au/course-requirements/>

(d) Unique Student Identifier (USI) requirement:

The USI is a mandatory data element of the Australian Vocational Education and Training Management Information Statistical Standard (AVETMISS). AVETMISS is the national data standard that ensures consistent and accurate capture and reporting of VET information about students. Students can create USI on their own or consent to AEA to create USI on their behalf.

(e) Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) requirement:

Applicants for Student visa must demonstrate they are coming to Australia temporarily with a genuine intention to study or to look after a person who is studying. For more details on GTE requirement visit <https://aust-education.com.au/course-requirements/>

(f) Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Test:

Applicants intending to undertake the VET courses at AEA are required to complete a mandatory LLN Test (Learning, Reading, Numeracy, Oral Communication and Writing). AEA may authorise its Education Agent to ensure the offshore students to complete the LLN test (Learning, Reading and Numeracy) under supervision while Oral Communication and Writing Section will be conducted at AEA upon arrival. Agents will use the Identification checklist provided by AEA to ensure authenticity and validity of the applicants. Onshore students will undertake LLN test at AEA or authorised Agents premises in Australia. The agents will email the completed LLN test to AEA.

(g) English Placement Test:

AEA will conduct a placement test to assess the level of English for those students who are onshore and do not have valid English test results such as IELTS/TOEFL/PTE or unable to provide the evidence that they are studying in Australia in past 2 years. The placement test will also be applied to those students who are issued with the CoEs after attending ELICOS from other colleges.

Candidates willing to undertake the AUR40216 - Certificate IV in Automotive Mechanical Diagnosis are required to have completed an automotive mechanical Certificate III qualification or be able to demonstrate equivalent competency.
